From the Principal

On this week's parsha and Yaakov's plans for how to survive Esav's impending attack, the Nachlas Moshe explains that Yaakov's tactics were designed to impart the importance of tefillah/prayer to future generations. With Yaakov Avinu, prayer for endurance and fortitude followed the delivery of gifts and preceded his least favored approach - war. Everything that we need and hope for should be accompanied by prayer, even if they seem to occur by natural means.

The Gemara (Rosh Hashana 18a) describes that Rabbi Meir used to say that if two people became ill with the same illness or two criminals were accused of the same crime, it is possible for only one to be saved; or for one to be acquitted and one convicted. One will live and one will die. How could that happen? The difference between them is that this one prayed and was answered, while that one prayed, but was not answered. Why was this one answered and that one not answered? Because the first one davened with his whole heart and, consequently, was answered, while the other did not daven with his whole heart and therefore was not answered.

When you think about it, we are talking about two people facing impending death. It is unlikely for a person's mind to wander when he is on his deathbed!! Clearly, the Gemara does not mean that one of them "spaced out" while praying and the other one did not.

Rav Elya Lopian explains that a "complete prayer" (tefillah shleimah) indicates that the person believes in Hashem's supremacy and the power of his own prayers. In the Gemara, the first person believed in the power of his tefilla, but the other did not have confidence that his prayer would be heard/answered. When we daven, our tefillos have a powerful impact, even if we do not realize it and even if we think that our prayers have gone unanswered. We do not always see the results, but we should be aware of their power!

Similarly, HaRav Henech Leibowitz, זצ"ל, on the issue of עירי מקלט (Cities of Refuge), said that although Hashem decreed that a certain person would fall off of a ladder and accidentally kill another person, if the Kohen Gadol had davened harder, the death would not have happened, despite the decree! The Rosh HaYeshiva shows from the Mesilas Yesharim (19) that this is true not only for a Kohen Gadol, but for each and every one of us. Every complete tefila has great power!
