Where is our principal?

Our principal was nominated and invited to present at the 2023 Oxford Roundtable at Oxford University, England, next week.

Oxford is the oldest English-speaking university in the world. Founded in 1096, it became a center for controversial issues and lively disputes. More recently, Oxford math professor and author Lewis Carroll wrote "Alice in Wonderland" there and Oxford graduate and professor of English Language and Literature J. R. R. Tolkien wrote "The Hobbit" and the "Lord of the Rings". Oxford is home to some of the most talented researchers in the world and has educated 28 of the world's Nobel Prize winners. And, once again, the University of Oxford has been named the best university in the world for a record seventh consecutive year in the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings 2023.

To celebrate the spirit of Oxford, the Roundtable convened in 1989 for the first time to consider major issues in contemporary educational policy throughout the world. Over time, the International Roundtable expanded its purpose to encompass current issues facing state and national systems and public policy. Today, the Roundtable invites selected leaders and scholars from both public and private sectors to participate in the forum. The focus of this year's forum is Education Issues and Trends and will feature our principal, Dr. Lea Goldstein's presentation, as well as 19 other presentations followed by roundtable discussions with delegates from around the world.
