From the Principal

In Parshas Emor, we find the words: "יְּלָא תְחַלְּלוֹ אָת־שֵׁם קְדְשָׁי" - "Do not profane My Holy Name". According to the Chofetz Chaim (in the pesicha to Sefer Chofetz Chaim), this is the sixth lav (prohibition) relating to lashon hara. In his Be'er Mayim Chaim, he explains the close, intertwined relationship between speaking lashon hara and transgressing the prohibition of "Do not profane My Holy Name".

The first reason is that lashon hara, in and of itself, does not provide a tangible benefit to the speaker or listener. The Gemara in Taanis (8a) tells us that in the future, all of the animals will gather around the snake and say to him: "A lion mauls its prey and eats it; a wolf rips apart its prey and eats it; but you, what pleasure do you have when you bite (a large animal or person that you are incapable of eating)?" The snake will say to them: "And what advantage does the speaker of lashon hara gain? A snake commonly kills prey and then slithers away without eating it. The ba'al lashon hara is the same, he kills with his words but does not gain a physical advantage. When someone receives a physical pleasure or advantage from a sin, it is, of course, still an aveira, but we are not perfect beings and in weak moments we can be tempted to do something that might provide an immediate pleasure or physical benefit. When it comes to lashon hara, however, since there is no physical pleasure or benefit, it is considered to be a flagrant desecration of Hashem and his mitzvos.

The second reason is that, because lashon hara has become so commonplace, people often trivialize the halachos and become unable to see their speech as even possibly violating the Torah. When you point out to the speaker that they're speaking lashon hara, the Chofetz Chaim says, the speaker will bring "one thousand reasons" as to why what he said was either permitted or actually obligated. Often, he will double down and say even more egregious lashon hara. The Chofetz Chaim asks: "הנמצא כזה בכל עונות שבעולם" - "Can you find any other sin that is like this?" When it comes to desecration of Hashem's name through lashon hara, it often leads people to speak more lashon hara!

The Takeaway:

Those who speak lashon hara, and particularly ba'alei lashon hara– those who habitually speak lashon hara - commit a chilul Hashem because they generally have no physical pleasure from their speech and, therefore, it appears as if they are simply and knowingly acting against Hashem and his mitzvos. Additionally, the baa'al lashon hara will find any excuse to justify his speech and even claim that it is required. This type of immunity to rebuke and twisting of halachah is a true chilul Hashem.
