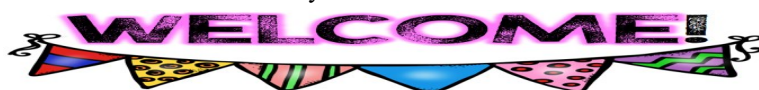
## ברוכים הבאים - Welcome back to DHR!!!
