
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Getting DHR

As many of you know, we were also searching for a new Kindergarten Judaic studies teacher for this coming year, and yet again, Hashem directed us to an amazing candidate in town - and one already part of the DHR team! Mrs. Shulman will continue to teach some DHR middle school girls' classes next year as well.

A very important goal at DHR is to create an environment in which everyone who enters our building feels safe and protected. The safety and security of our students, faculty, and staff is a very high priority for us. It was with that in mind that we applied for the New York State 2017-18 Securing Communities Against Hate Crimes Grant. We are grateful that the state approved our grant proposal in full (DHR is one of only 30 organizations statewide that was approved for this grant). We will use the funds to build a perimeter fence, upgrade our existing surveillance and security system, and install shatter-proof windows on our ground floor.

At DHR, we do our utmost to stay at the cutting edge of what are considered best practices in educational methodology and technology. We are excited to announce that we have already received one of what will hopefully be three new interactive Smartboards this year through the NYS Smart Schools Bond Act. We are hoping to install these Smartboards in different classrooms throughout the school as the funding is approved, providing a tremendous learning resource for more of our students. This week, our Building Manager, Rabbi Ross Kosow, installed the first SmartBoard Interactive Flat Panel in the first grade classroom!

At DHR, we pride ourselves on our ability to offer additional support services through the local school districts and through Title I; however, these support general studies only. One of the admirable qualities of the Jewish community throughout the ages has been our dedication to endow our children with knowledge of our Holy Torah, our traditions, and our language. Some students struggle in these subjects as well, and we know it is worthwhile and essential to invest our resources in supporting students in limudei kodesh subjects, thereby strengthening their chances of becoming well-educated Torah observant Jews. This past year, on a very limited basis, we were able to facilitate additional kriyah support through Mrs. Devorah Shulman. Mrs. Michal Davidowitz donated her time to work with many students on dikduk and kriyah as well, and both did a tremendous service for our students. This coming school year, we will be taking the next step in providing extra support for children struggling in Judaic studies by creating JLab- the Jewish Learning and Skill Building Center. This will be an official halftime Judaic Title I-like support service which will be headed by the one and only Rabbi Adam Aranov, who will be joining our staff to lead this department. Welcome, Rabbi Aranov!

At the end of the school year, two of our dedicated, veteran educators, Mr. Hank Elich and Dr. Linda Podewils, retired from DHR. We appreciate their years of service and wish them only happiness and success. We hope they come back to visit us!

Summer vacation is the time for students to relax, have fun, recharge their batteries and gear up for another year of important, exciting and meaningful learning. However, as we've all noticed, students experience learning losses when they do not engage in educational activities during the summer. Educational experts have estimated that up to 80% of what children are taught in school can be lost over the summer if it is not reinforced. Since DHR always endeavors to be on the cutting edge of educational progress, we have continued what we started last summer: DHR's recommended school-wide summer learning program. The purpose of the summer packets is NOT to teach new skills, but to help students review what they've learned over the school year. If your child has misplaced his/her summer packets, they are conveniently posted on our website under the "Downloads" tab. As an incentive, all students who complete their summer packets will be awarded Derech HaTorah Dollars that they can use at the DHR Student Store for Great Stuff during the first week of school in September.
