Additionally, please note that scholarship forms can not be processed until the current year's tuition is completely paid up or the school has post-dated checks for the full amount due. Finally, we cannot process scholarship forms unless students are registered and the registration fee has been paid. If you have not yet registered your children and you need extra registration forms, they are available online (www.derechhatorah.org).
